“Skilled Veterans Corps for Fukushima” has been formed in April 2011 by aged persons, mainly veteran engineers and technicians, to work at the site employing their experiences and capabilities, in order to decrease doses of young generation working for cleanup of Fukushima Daiichi. In July, 2011 SVCF was registered as an Ordinary Corporation, and in April, 2012 it has been approved as Public Service Corporation by Cabinet Office, Government of Japan and is ready to promote projects for public services. SVCF has approximately 700 members and over 1600 supporting members.

In July, 2011 SVCF despatched inspection team consisting of 5 members to Fukushima Daiichi, and observed seriously destroyed building of Unit 4 which has been damaged by Hydrogen explosion. They have confirmed that it is essential, for the cleanup of Fukushima Daiichi, to overcome temporary stage and to form National Project Team adopting Project Management System. SVCF further proposing to employ worldwide expertises not only in the field of R&D but also site work.

In addition to above, SVCF is promoting support activities for local governments around Fukushima Daiichi for their rehabilitation as well as returning to home.

We sincerely ask your supports and collaboration to promote project for cleanup Fukushima Daiichi.

SVCF will continue to promote several project with the slogan of “Veterans’ Power for Cleanup Fukushima”

Standing Point

SVCF never claims ideology, belief and feeling of each member. Stand point for Nuclear Power is also not the same among members. Only the single point agreed is to settle and cleanup Fukushima Daiichi. Each member fights against the unprecedented accident fully employing his/her accumulated capability, respecting each other: this is the basic stand point of SVCF.

Organization

A party consisting of free individuals for "Cleanup of Fukushima"

SVCF consists of voluntary members and the organization is operated by independent individuals, only following purposes and tasks defined by the articles of SVCF.

Members and supporters of SVCF counts approx. 2300 as of June 2012, which consists of wide ranged capabilities. Many of them are working in several fields applying each capabilities.

Conference in Diet

Monthly conferences are held in Diet Members Office to make approaches to Diet Member and to discuss among SVCF members.

Symposium / Lecture

Propagating purposes and activities, SVCF organizes and/or attend symposiums, lectures, etc.

Seminar / Lessons

Basic knowledge of radiation, status of Fukushima Daiichi, Structure of nuclear power plant, monitoring, etc. are the subjects of seminars for SVCF members.

Monitoring

Monitoring services are offered to local government, company, community, etc.

Watching

Nuclear Power Watcher Team analyses status of Fukushima Daiichi watching monthly report of TEPCO as well as reports on media.

Watcher for Administration, Laws, etc. Team surveys activities of central/local government, revision of laws and ordinances in relation to Fukushima Daiichi Accident.
